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Appendix I

ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE IMPACTS ANALYSIS

I.1 Background

Executive Order No. 12898, Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority and Low-Income Populations, directs individual Federal agencies to develop approaches that address concerns regarding environmental justice. Based on this Executive Order, the Board's Section of Environmental Analysis (SEA) identified minority and low-income environmental justice communities and determined if they would bear the high and adverse impacts of the Proposed Action disproportionately. This appendix presents the methodology implemented by SEA to identify the affected environmental justice communities and assess the level of impact borne by these communities. The methodology utilized by SEA is similar to the methodology previously established by SEA for the NEPA documentation for the CN/IC, Conrail, and Bayport Loop transactions.

I.2 Environmental Justice Impacts Methodology

The first step in the analysis was to identify communities affected by the Proposed Action and determine which ones were considered minority or low-income communities. The potentially affected communities are located in Lake, Cook, DuPage, and Will Counties in Illinois, and Lake County in Indiana.

The SEA identified key census block groups that are within the area of potential effect (AoPE). The AoPE is defined as a zone within 400 feet of rail segments which would experience a decrease of at least eight trains per day or within 1,500 feet of rail segments that would experience an increase of at least eight additional trains per day. Based on the Proposed Action, SEA identified 161 census block groups along the EJ&E rail line that lie within the 1,500 feet AoPE.

Data from the U.S. Census Bureau for each census block group was reviewed by SEA to determine if it met the environmental justice criteria developed by the EPA and SEA for minority or low-income status. These criteria are:

- At least one-half of the census block group is of minority status
- At least one-half of the census block group is of low-income status
- The percentage of minority status is at least 10 percentage points higher than for the entire county in which the population is located
- The percentage of low-income status is at least 10 percentage points higher than for the entire county in which the population is located

Table 1.2-1 summarizes the results of the environmental justice criteria for minority and low-income census block groups in each county.

Applying these criteria to the affected census block group resulted in 67 block groups meeting the environmental justice criteria for minority status and 26 meeting the environmental justice criteria for low-income status. Table I.2-4 presents the results of the evaluation of census block groups that meet the status for minority populations and Table I.2-5 presents the results of the evaluation of census block groups that meet low-income status.

I.2.1 Assess High and Adverse Impacts

The second step of the environmental justice analysis involved determining the impacts of the Proposed Action that are considered high and adverse. SEA assessed safety and delay impacts at-grade crossings and train noise levels for the potential to have significant impacts on the census block groups affected by the Proposed Action. For each environmental impact that is determined to have high and adverse impacts on the communities, SEA assessed whether the impacts were disproportionately borne by the environmental justice communities.

I.2.2 Safety and Delay Impact Analysis

SEA evaluated safety and delay impacts to at-grade crossings. Impacts to census block groups are based on the number of at-grade crossings that experience either significant safety or delay impacts. A census block group that is impacted by three or more at-grade crossings that have significant safety or delay impacts is considered to be highly and adversely affected. Crossings experiencing significant safety impacts are those where the predicted collisions increase or decreases greater than 0.05 (one accident in 20 years). Significant delay impacts are defined as crossings that experience a change in level of service from C or better to D or worse.

This evaluation was completed for the minority analysis and low-income analysis. Based on this evaluation, SEA determined that no census block group (neither the environmental justice census block groups nor non-environmental justice census block groups) experiences high and adverse affects caused by safety and delay impacts at-grade crossings.

I.2.3 Noise Impact Analysis

Noise contours were developed based on train noise, including horn noise, post-Proposed Action. A system was developed to score the severity of the noise impacts. Noise levels less than 65 dBA L_{dn} receive a score of zero; noise levels between 65 dBA L_{dn} and 69 dBA L_{dn} receive a score of 3; and noise levels equal to or greater than 70 dBA L_{dn} receive a score of 5. Any census block group with a train noise impact score of four or higher is considered a high and adverse impact.

Based on this scoring system there are census block groups within the AoPE that experience significant impact. A statistical analysis resulted in a certainty of greater than 50 percent indicating that minority and low-income environmental justice census block groups experience significant impacts from train noise. Table I.2-2 and Table I.2-3 on the next page, summarize the actual and

impacts from train noise. Table I.2-2 and Table I.2-3 on the next page, summarize the actual and expected train noise impacts for the analysis of minority environmental justice block groups and the analysis of low-income environmental justice block groups, respectively. Further analysis revealed that the high and adverse train noise impacts are not disproportionately borne by minority or low-income environmental justice populations.
