Troy,

We appreciate the copy of the SHPO's response to this project. We note that the SHPO has requested that the Little River Spur of the FEC railway be documented historically with at least a Florida Master Site File form with accompanying photographs. This documentation (historic structures) would cover half of what is normally covered in a standard cultural resource management (CRM) desktop analysis in the State of Florida. Typically, in addition to the historic structure documentation, a desktop analysis would also include an assessment by a professional archaeologist that would include background analysis of the project area, including examination of historic aerial photographs, maps, original land survey notes, soil surveys, etc, in order to establish zones of archaeological probability for the project area. It is the opinion of our office (THPO) that a full desktop analysis, including the development of zones of archaeological probability for the Little River Spur, would be appropriate for this project before demolition begins. This analysis would neither be costly nor time-consuming.

We appreciate your suggestion of the inclusion of an unanticipated finds clause in the permit that you will issue to the FEC for this project. We agree that this clause should state that, if unanticipated archaeological remains are uncovered during the proposed project, work in the immediate vicinity of the finds should cease until consultation with the SHPO and THPO of the Seminole Tribe of Florida, and any other relevant nationally recognized Tribe, has been completed.

Thank you for continuing to consult with this office on this project. We look forward to working with you on future projects as well. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any further comments or questions concerning this or any project.
