COMMENT: I would like to address Measure 45 on pag 4-112 stream bank stabilization. The use of rock for riprap is a problem. First riprap is a bad environmental practice. Barbs designed right would be a much better erosion control as well as further downstream erosion. Barbs slow rivers down and help in promoting vegetation etc.

The Rosebud Conservation District would prefer the use of formed cement blocks in stream bank stabilization instead of rocks. Rocks are removed from wherever they come from & leave exposed soil which will in turn cause erosion elsewhere, more sediment in rivers etc. These blocks weigh in the neighborhood of a ton so wouldn't be so apt to move & therefore reduce rock collection. Would strongly encourage DEQ & Corps of Engineers to consider this as being better stewards than Burlington Northern & many other railroads whom always
