**Re: STB Finance Docket No. 33407, Dakota, Minnesota and Eastern Railroad Corporation, Powder River Basin Expansion Project; Invitation for Tribal Participation in Archaeological Fieldwork**

Dear Mr. Yellowman:

As you know, the Surface Transportation Board's (Board) Section of Environmental Analysis (SEA) recently hosted a Tribal Summit in Rapid City, SD, October 9-11. During the Summit, tribal attendees<sup>1</sup> expressed concerns regarding archaeological field studies planned by the Dakota, Minnesota and Eastern Railroad (DM&E) immediately following the Summit. The tribes told SEA that they want to have the opportunity to participate in these surveys, of which they were previously unaware. In order to respond to the tribes' concerns, SEA has requested and DM&E has suspended all archaeological field work (Phase I and Phase II) until Monday, November 5, 2007.

Between now and November 5, SEA would like to provide your Tribal government an opportunity to enlist official tribal representatives to join the archaeologists in the field surveys scheduled for this fall season. (Attached is a summary table of the planned field work including locations, intended work activities and start dates).

SEA will be holding a meeting on October 30 and 31 for all tribal representatives specifically interested in the Mankato to New Ulm, Minnesota section of the project area. The meeting will include a visit to several known Native American sites scheduled for archaeological testing beginning November 5, 2007 and will allow tribal representatives an opportunity to assess the need for additional tribal field participation in this segment of the project area. Lodging accommodations and meeting facilities will be provided for meeting participants at the Jackpot Junction Casino Hotel located at the Lower Sioux Indian Community in Morton, Minnesota. DM&E will provide access to the site areas via high rail.

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

**We are also requesting Tribal participation for archaeological survey and site testing work scheduled at three different locations along the project corridor west of Pierre, South Dakota (see attached summary table). This fieldwork is also scheduled to begin on November 5, 2007. No pre-field coordination meeting is planned prior to beginning work in these areas; instead, SEA is requesting that interested Tribes provide us with names of Tribal representatives that you wish to have participate on your behalf.**

If you wish to participate in the meeting in Minnesota on October 30-31 and/or if you wish to provide Tribal representatives to join the archaeological survey teams working west of Pierre, please contact SEA's Third-Party Contractor (Randy Withrow of The Louis Berger Group 319-373-3043) no later than October 26<sup>th</sup>. Please be prepared to provide us with the name(s) of your designated representatives, contact information, and honorarium, housing, mileage and per diem needs. DM&E will develop contracts and make other arrangements, as appropriate, for those Tribes that intend to provide official Tribal representatives to assist with the field surveys in these project segments.

We will follow-up with phone calls to your Tribe early next week to confirm your interest and availability to assist with this work. Thank you for providing SEA with your continued guidance and participation in this project.
